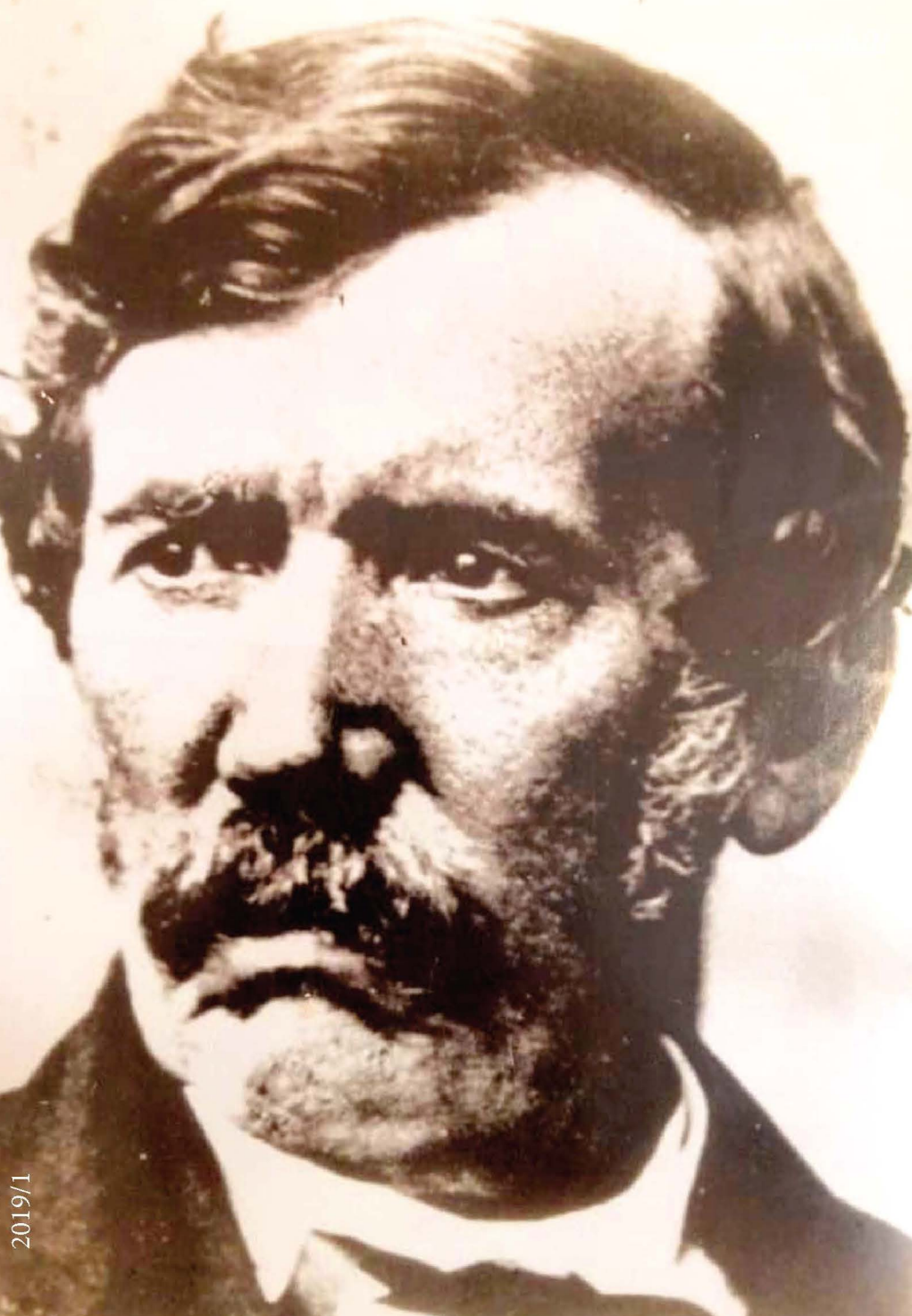




DR. DAVID LIVINGSTONE MEMORIAL MUSEUM UJIJI





Introduction

The Dr. David Livingstone Memorial Museum is located in western side of Kigoma urban, Kigoma south division, Kitongoni Ward, Mnazi Mmoja Street. The museum is located about 7 Kilometers from Kigoma main train station, and it is near Ujiji small port and its only 700 meters from Lake Tanganyika beach.

History background

The historical Museum discovered its potential in 1818 when Tanzania (before Tanganyika) was under British colonization. The idea generated due to the existence of mango tree where Dr. Livingstone and his former potters (namely Chuma and Susi) decided to establish their temporary base settlement. Not only that but also it was under that mango tree Dr. David Livingstone and Henry Morton Stanley met for the first time in 1871. However, in 1920's the historic mango tree was weakened therefore British government decided to cut the mango tree and Monument was officially built in 1927.

Lake Tanganyika

Dr. David Livingstone Memorial Museum site is located near Lake Tanganyika approximately 700m. Lake Tanganyika is the longest and deepest Lake in Africa, the second deepest Lake in the world with depth of 1447m, width 70kms from East to West and it is also the world's longest fresh water Lake with width of 675 kms. This Lake provide a breeding ground to more than 300 species of fish including ornamental cichlid



How to reach the site “Accessibility”

By bus - When you arrived at the Kigoma's bus terminal we advise you to take a taxi, motorcycle or bajaj to the museum

By train - After Kigoma train station arrival, we advise you to take Bajaj, Motorcycle or taxi to the museum

By flight - After kigoma airport arrival you are advised to rent a taxi to the museum

Tourism Activities

The main tourism activities within the site includes short guided tour but with heavy interesting historical information.

The Museum is full of both historic and cultural collections which are supporting the memorial evidence.

- **Displays (Pictures)**

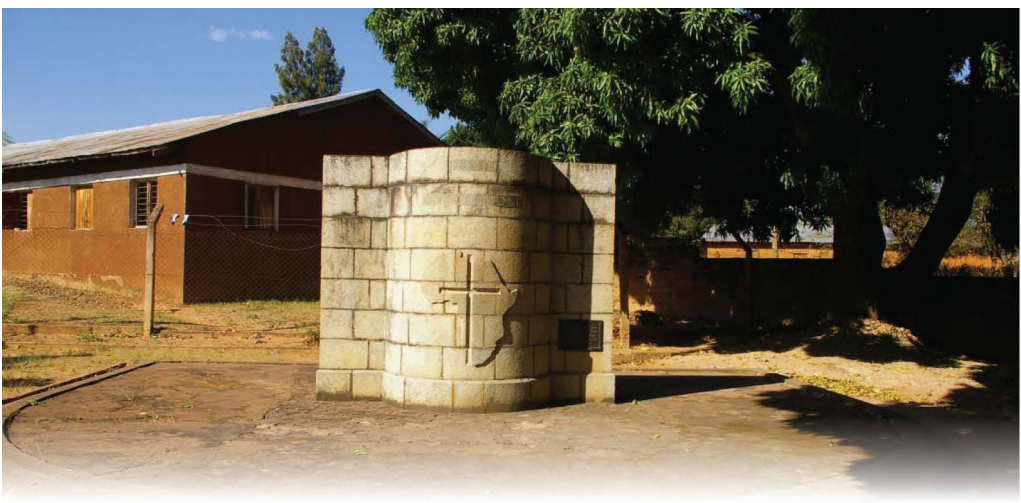
The Museum contents are dominated by historic well kept photos which offer you a clear memory of what were happening during the slave trade period and Dr.Livingstone panorama.

Kigoma Historia, Utamaduni na Uchumi Its history, Culture and Economy

Kutokana na historia ndefu ya mwingiliano na inchanganyiko wa jamii mbalimbali iliyobabisha kuvuka na dini mbalimbali kama ukristu, uislamu na dini za oyiti za kichiko. Katika soko za leo Kigoma inafahamika sana kwa kuwa na mizamo thabiti wa kisiasa katika Tanzania. Katika Historia ya Tanganyika na Tanzania mkoa wa Kigoma ndiyo mkoa pakee uliyokuwa na Difu wa Kike -Theresa Ntare.

Given the long history of peoples' interactions the predominant religion of the region are Christianity (Roman Catholic), Islam and Traditional African religion. Indeed, one of the predominant features of Kigoma people is their openness in the parts of the country and that the region has produced famous poets and spammers. This is one of the regions in the country to have had a woman Chief Theresa Ntare during the colonial period.





- **Guided visit of historic Ujiji Town**

Ujiji town is a historic town with a lot of historical evidence such as German buildings built during colonial era, the central ivory and slave trade route which starts from Ujiji to Bagamoyo, German wells and Arab mosque to mention a few.
